Decommissioning

All oil companies should restore the locations where they have worked to their original condition. They should ensure that there is no environmental damage resulting from their operations.

Licensing

The cycle begins when the government gives a license to a company to explore a certain area for oil and gas;



Production

This is when the company begins to bring oil from underground and transport it to be refined at a refinery and then sold on the market.



Exploration


Once given a license to explore in a particular area an oil company begins to look for oil and gas under the ground in the area that has been licensed to them.



Development

During this phase the oil company begins to drill production wells.

These are the wells that will actually bring the oil to the land surface so it can be processed and transported to the market.



Pre-Development

Once an oil company has decided there is enough oil under the ground to try and bring it to the surface, it begins to develop the plans for producing and transporting the oil to the market.



When oil is found in a well, the company then drills more wells to understand how much oil is available, what the quality is and how it might behave as it flows to the surface.








