
Strengthening Accountability Empowering Communities

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Nigeria's extractive regions faced corruption, oil pollution, environmental degradation, limited civic space, and exclusion of women and youth from public decision-making.

Communities lacked access to information, transparency tools, and negotiation power with

government and companies.



strengthened transparency,
accountability, and inclusive
governance in Nigeria's extractive
sector, fiscal systems, and civic
space. It empowered women, youth,
and communities through advocacy,
capacity building, and community
mobilization. The project also
improved civic participation,
advanced gender inclusion, and
supported climate justice actions
across multiple states.

PROJECT PATHWAYS

PATHWAY 1

Extractive Governance
Democratizing the extractive sector and supporting implementation of the Petroleum Industry Act (PIA), including establishing Host Community Development Trusts (HCDTs).

PATHWAY 3

Expanding Civic Space
Strengthening citizen engagement, FOI coalitions, civic clubs, and protection of journalists and activists.

PATHWAY 2

Fiscal Justice and Transparency Strengthening tax reforms, budget monitoring, beneficial ownership transparency, and anti-corruption accountability.

PATHWAY 4

Gender and Community Inclusion Promoting women-led accountability, participation in governance, climate justice advocacy, and financial resilience through VSLAs.


