Facilitating Change: Capacity-Building Workshop for Women in Michika

The training for women platform facilitators from Michika LGA, North East Nigeria, was conducted from June 19th to 20th, 2024, at the Civic Centre Hall in Michika, Adamawa State. This two-day workshop, organized by The Centre for Public Education and Mobilization for Development in Nigeria (CEPAD - Nigeria), saw the participation of 16 facilitators and was led by project officers.

The primary objective of the training was to enhance the facilitators' capacity to effectively disseminate key topics to women platform members within their communities. The workshop focused on critical areas, including Women, Peace, and Security, Advocacy and Communication, Sexual and Gender-Based Violence, Women's Livelihood Empowerment, and Basic Hygiene.



West Africa Regional Knowledge Exchange

The <u>Voice</u> project team in Nigeria took part in the West Africa Regional Knowledge Exchange, which focused on reflecting on the evolving political landscape within the ECOWAS region and its impact on civil society and the inclusion of marginalized groups. The workshop served as both a platform for critical reflection and a celebration of the region's rich cultural diversity. Participants explored innovative strategies to enhance collaboration across language barriers, promoting collective action throughout the region. Reducing Dependency: A New Approach to Seed Distribution in West Africa.

Access to quality seeds is fundamental for producing nutritious and climate-resilient crops. Hence, the need for a dialogue surrounding sustainable seed solutions is crucial for enhancing food security and nutrition. In Abuja, Nigeria, Oxfam hosted a roundtable dialogue with humanitarian actors and stakeholders to discuss strategies for improving local seed systems in West Africa. This conversation emphasizes the need for innovative seed systems that not only improve agricultural productivity but also support smallholder farmers, who are often the most vulnerable to food insecurity.

Nigeria: A Financial Powerhouse Battling Illicit Outflows

Nigeria's economic potential is immense yet hindered by significant illicit financial flows. To address this, the <u>Fair</u> <u>Finance</u> Nigeria coalition, led by Oxfam and the <u>Civil Society Legislative Advocacy Centre (CISLAC)</u> have begun strategic engagements with the banking sector regulators; Chartered Institute of Bankers of Nigeria - CIBN and the Banker Directors Association of Nigeria (BDAN) to foster collaboration on combating illicit financial flows and promoting sustainable banking practices.

Women's Rights Spotlight: A New Radio Show in Adamawa State

The essence of this project lies in addressing the critical issues faced by women in Adamawa, including gender-based violence, child marriage, and limited access to education and healthcare. By creating a platform for dialogue and awareness, we aim to empower women and girls, giving them a voice to advocate for their rights and well-being.

The radio show will serve as a vital resource for sharing information, inspiring stories, and practical advice to help women navigate the challenges they encounter.

Sustaining Impact: Asset Redistribution for Lasting Change in Taraba State

In a bid to strengthen community resilience and support local development, we have distributed essential assets from our concluded <u>PROSELL</u> project, including pick-up trucks, motorcycles, generators, office equipment, laptops, and tablets. These resources have been allocated to various communities, civil society organizations, and government institutions across Taraba State. By providing these tools, we aim to empower local stakeholders to take charge of their development and enhance their capacity to address challenges effectively.

This redistribution not only signifies our dedication to ensuring that the benefits of the project continue to resonate within the communities but also reflects our belief in the potential of local actors to drive sustainable change.







Advancing Fair Taxation: Two-Day Review Meeting on Governance Frameworks

The Tax Justice and Governance Platform (TJ&GP) has made substantial progress in promoting tax rights and fostering accountability among citizens and the government. Through its efforts, awareness of tax obligations has increased, particularly within the informal economic sector, empowering individuals to demand accountability and contribute to the review of tax policy frameworks. This has led to the abolition of detrimental practices in tax administration and enhanced stakeholder consultations during planning and decision-making processes.

Recently, the TJ&GP held a two-day review and reflection meeting, supported by key partners including Oxfam, Centre for LegislatielSLAC, Christian Aid, Action Aid, the International Budget Partnership, the Nigeria Labour Congress, and the Centre for Democratic Development. The meeting aimed to refine the platform's foundational documents, governance frameworks, and operational procedures at both national and sub-national levels. This process is vital for clarifying roles, responsibilities, and decision-making channels, ensuring the platform's effectiveness.



Strengthening Partnerships and Driving Impact: Asalama Sidi visits Nigeria

We were honoured to host the Deputy Director of Oxfam in Africa during her recent visit to our Nigeria Country Office. Her visit highlights our commitment to building stronger partnerships and driving impactful change across the region.

During her stay, she engaged in productive discussions with key government stakeholders, staff, and our dedicated partners. These conversations focused on our shared goals of alleviating poverty and empowering communities.

A highlight of her visit was the field trip to one of our project sites in Nasarawa State, accompanied by our Country Director. Together, they launched the distribution of 1,500 improved oil palm seedlings in Lafia, Obi, Akwanga, Nass. Egbon, and Kokona Local Government Areas. This initiative is a significant step towards boosting agricultural productivity and enhancing the livelihoods of smallholder farmers in the region.





Advancing Women's Rights and Leadership: Outcomes from Michika's Women Platform

The Community Women Platform meetings were held across eight wards in Michika LGA. These meetings brought together women and young girls from various groups within the community. The primary aim was to create safe, community-based spaces for women to engage in dialogues on topics such as empowerment, leadership, women's rights, gender-based violence (GBV), advocacy, and communication.

Key objectives included:

- Building women's capacity for participation in socio-economic and political activities.
- Amplifying women's voices in decision-making and community development.
- Strengthening women's roles in combating rights violations and harmful gender norms.
- Encouraging women's participation in preventing and responding to security threats and violent extremism.

These platforms empower women to challenge inequalities and drive positive change in their communities.

International Youth Day: From Awareness to Action

On International Youth Day, we successfully hosted a two-day event in partnership with the <u>Network of Youth for</u> <u>Sustainable Initiative (NGYouthSDGs)</u> and the <u>Global Initiative for Food Security and Ecosystem Preservation</u>. The event aimed to enhance Nigeria's commitment to the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and foster intergenerational collaboration among youth and stakeholders.

Attracting 650 in-person and 1,800 virtual participants, the event brought together young people, civil society organizations, government officials, international development partners, media and private sector representatives. Discussions emphasized the urgent need for accelerated actions towards achieving the SDGs in Nigeria and highlighted the pivotal role of youth in this endeavor.

The sessions brought together community members eager to learn about effective savings practices and loan management, enabling them to better support their livelihoods. Participants were equipped with the tools necessary to create sustainable savings groups that can provide financial services in areas with limited access to formal banking.

By strengthening these community-based financial mechanisms, Oxfam aims to enhance the economic stability of vulnerable populations and promote self-sufficiency. The initiative underscores the importance of local ownership in driving sustainable development.
