ABOUT PROSELL

PROSELL is a 66-month Food Security and Resilience project funded by the European Union and implemented by Oxfam and Development Exchange Centre (DEC) in Taraba State. It helped to improve the food security and resilience of over 42,000 households, and improve the livelihoods of poor farming households in 80 rural communities in six LGAs of Taraba State

To build the resilience of 40,000 small farmers, fishermen and livestock owners (women, youths, and vulnerable households) on commodity value chain and rural enterprise in Taraba State.

Project Goal

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- Increase the income of small-scale farmers by enhancing their agricultural productivity, market access, and job creation along crop, fish and livestock value chains
- 7 To enhance adaptive capacities and resilience of small-scale farming households to climate change.
- 7 Promote cooperation and mutual benefits of farmers, livestock owners, and all value chain actors.

RESOURCE PROVISION

3 Climate change adaptation plans developed: (i) Use of alternative energy for cooking, (ii) reduction in felling of trees, and (iii) Tree planting and natural regeneration.

44 private nursery owners trained to raise tree seedlings.

700 food reserve/grain banks built, supplying 660.93 tons of grains to 16.184 households (8.349 Women and 7.835 Men).

6.729 Cash for Work beneficiaries (3,396 Women, 4,333 Men).

52.495 bags of fertilizers distributed (NPK = 43.843: Urea = 8.652).

9.000 female headed households received home gardening kits for vegetable farming.

6 greenhouses established in 6 LGAs.

4.500 individuals received livestock (2.444 Women, 2.056 Men); 2.500 Does, 500 Bucks, 2,000 Ewes, 500 Rams 4.500 Cockerels, 45,000 Local Hens

264 water pumps distributed to households (43 Women, 221 Men) for dry season irrigation farming.

- 39.740 individuals trained in good agronomic practices (18,644 Women, 21.126 Men).

Return on Savings

The Village Savings and Loan Association (VSLA) is a key part of Oxfam's gender-focused initiatives in Nigeria, providing self-managed community groups with basic financial services. These groups, comprising 15 to 25 members, aim to increase household financial assets and reduce vulnerability to shocks by offering secure savings, flexible borrowing, and affordable social insurance. After about 12 months, savings and earnings are distributed proportionally among the members.

GOVERNANCE AND INFLUENCING

- PROSELL supported state government in Open Government Partnership, developed State Action Plan, gazetted VAPP Law, organized first State Budget Town-Hall, and conducted four budget analyses with two published reports and two community development planning evaluations.
- 215 radio programme episodes aired.
